



Marriage-Based Green Card

FOR SPOUSES OF U.S. CITIZENS LAWFULLY RESIDING IN THE UNITED STATES

This checklist is intended as a general guide only. Document requirements vary by case and this list may not reflect all documents required for your specific situation.

Identity & Personal Documents

- Two passport-style photographs for both the petitioner and the foreign spouse (per Form I-485 requirements)
- Government-issued photo ID
- Birth Certificate (or acceptable alternative if unavailable)
- Valid passport for foreign spouse

Marriage & Relationship Documents

- Government-issued Marriage Certificate
- Divorce decrees or death certificates from any prior marriages (both spouses)
- Evidence of legal name changes (if applicable)

Proof of U.S. Citizenship — Choose One

- Valid U.S. Passport
- U.S. Birth Certificate
- Consular Report of Birth Abroad
- Naturalization Certificate
- Certificate of Citizenship

Proof of a Bona Fide Marriage

- Joint bank account statements
- Lease or mortgage documents listing both spouses
- Joint utility bills or insurance policies
- Photos together over time
- Communication records (emails, messages, call logs)
- Affidavits from friends or family who can speak to your relationship

Required USCIS Forms

- Form I-130 — Petition for Alien Relative
- Form I-130A — Supplemental Information for Spouse Beneficiary
- Form I-485 — Application to Register Permanent Residence or Adjust Status
- Form I-864 — Affidavit of Support
- Form I-693 — Report of Immigration Medical Examination and Vaccination Record

Optional — Commonly Filed Together:

- Form I-765 — Application for Employment Authorization
- Form I-131 — Application for Travel Documents

Financial Documents

- Most recent federal tax returns
- Recent pay stubs
- W-2s or 1099s
- Bank statements

Prior Immigration History (if applicable)

- Any prior U.S. immigration documents
- Certified police and court records of any criminal charges or convictions
- Documentation of past J-1 or J-2 nonimmigrant status

Important Reminders

- Any documents not in English must include a certified English translation
- Keep all original documents available — USCIS may request them at any time
- Always verify current fees, deadlines, and requirements directly with USCIS before filing
